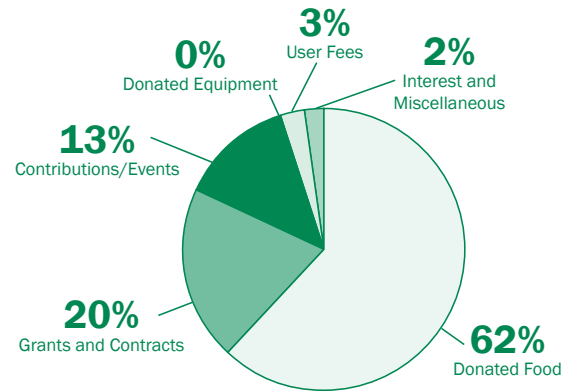

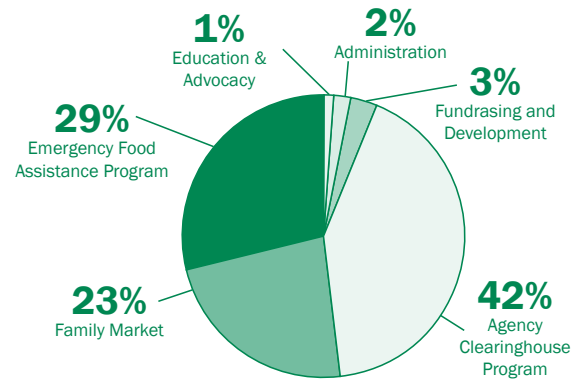

Food Bank Programs

The Agency Clearinghouse: the primary food resource for Monterey County nonprofit agencies

- 90 member agencies
- 1,888,876 pounds of food distributed

The Emergency Food Assistance Program:

our largest food distribution service

- 26 sites countywide
- Monthly average of 6,439 households served
- 2,658,685 pounds of food distributed

The Family Market: fresh produce and more in a Farmers Market setting

- 10 sites countywide
- Monthly average of 2,413 households served
- 1,370,569 pounds of food distributed
